Recipe

Do you need a good Halloween gift? Well you just found one. This is a recipe for candy bark. There are 5 steps to complete this delicious treat. Please enjoy.

You will need:

- Candy melts or almond bark
- Assorted mix-ins, such as small candy, break them to bite-size pieces

1. Cover a baking sheet with wax paper. Make sure your hands, bowl and utensils are completely dry.
 2. Microwave 2 cups of candy melts in a bowl for 30 seconds at a time until melted. Stir with a spoon until smooth.
 3. Stir in about 1/2 cup of mix-ins until coated. Add more if you'd like.
 4. Pour the candy mixture onto the wax paper. Use a spoon to spread the mixture smoothly and evenly. Sprinkle extra mix-ins over the top of the bark.
 5. Let bark cool completely. Then break into 2-inch pieces. Store in a airtight container.

Place some bark in a plastic treat bag and tie with a ribbon. Put the bag inside a festive container and give it to a teacher or friend!

Try these combinations or make your own=

1. Milk chocolate candy melts + peanut candy + peanut butter cups.
2. Dark chocolate candy melts + green candy melts + mint chocolate sandwich cookies.
3. Dark chocolate candy melts + crisp rice cereal + mini marshmallows.
